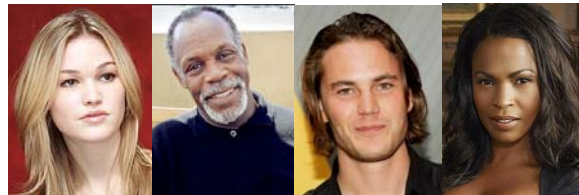

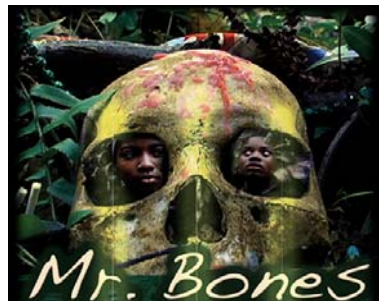
A full day of premiere provocative films

reminds us to take nothing and no one for granted, and gently teaches us to be thankful for what we have.



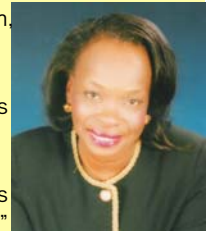
